There were plenty of ideas and officers have been working on the proposals and scoping documents to enable councillors to develop the ideas in actions and future plans. An immediate change has been the introduction of a paper light council, members of the public will still have paper copies of council agendas and minutes at the meetings however councillors have committed to go paper free saving the council money on paper and printing costs.

I've been welcomed by uniformed groups at their meetings, met the Bowling Club and Tennis Coaches and spent time at the allotments. The cemetery is often one of my favourite reflective places as it has beautiful views across to Portsdown.

This month has seen us preparing the War Memorial ready for the Remembrance Parade on the 10th of November. The stone has been cleaned by a local stonemason, hedges trimmed and weeds removed. We are hoping for nice weather like last year however I am sure there will be a good turnout regardless of the conditions. A reminder that St John's Road will be closed from 10am until 12pm midday between Bursledon Road and Vicarage Drive on the 10th of November.

The Fireworks Fiesta will return on the 9th of November as permission was granted to use Greta Park for this as per previous years. Although it may seem some distance away we have been planning the Christmas Lights Switch on since May and bookings are now open for stallholders. Please see the website for the details. 125TH TOWN COUNCIL ANNIVERSARY



On the Friday 22nd of November, Hedge End Town Council will be celebrating a hundred and twenty-five years since its founding in 1894. To celebrate we will be hosting a day of activities to get involved with, whilst looking back at the history of Hedge End and the defining moments of change in this ever-growing town.

Although the origin of the name Hedge End is uncertain, it is thought that the area of Hedge End was originally called the 'enclosure of Botley' but in 1863 the name Hedge End was adopted (end of the Hedge of Botley Common). On the 4th of December In 1894 a civil parish was established and the first council was elected. The official meeting was in the National school on the 14th December 1894. All six newly elected member were present Messrs, Hellyar, Coward, Sharpe snr Hibberd, Wellstead and Oxford. The population of the village at this time was just seven hundred!

Hedge End Town Council could not be more delighted to share with you the good news! For the tenth year running Albert Road Cemetery in Hedge End has been recognised by the Green Flag Award Scheme as one of the very best in the UK. This international award, now into its third decade, is a sign to the public that the space boasts the highest possible environmental standards, is beautifully maintained and has excellent visitor facilities.



FINANCE 🞊

Following the appointment of our new Town Clerk the members of the Policy and Resources Committee (Formerly Finance and Administration) have been reviewing a number of areas within our operations where we might be more efficient or energy efficient.

Firstly, we are proposing to make the Council a "paperless" authority with all of our agendas, reports and minutes being available on the internet or website. Most Councillors have access to tablets or laptops and can access all reports and papers through this means. We may, however, need to acquire several tablets for those who do not, but, over the life of this Council, we anticipate that there will be a net saving. Papers copies can be provided to members of the public, if required, at our meetings.



Secondly, we are reviewing our approach to energy efficiency and savings. Many authorities have declared "Climate Emergencies" and whilst the Town Council is a small authority we will be looking at what we can do to be more energy efficient and to look at ways to reduce our carbon footprint. There will be some relatively easy options to reduce our energy consumption but the reduction of our carbon footprint may take longer as we look at possibly changing to electric vehicles for our ground staff.

Another area which has been reviewed is our communications policy which will include looking at ways in which we present information and news through via the internet and social media. We will be looking at our website to create easier access format and layout of our website together with greater use of Facebook, Twitter etc.

There are other areas of review underway both by this Committee and members of the Recreation and Amenities Committee and we will let you know of these as they develop.

Remember the Policy and Resources committee meets monthly and that our meetings are open to the public. We are always pleased to welcome visitors.

An Interview with a Key Member of the Hedge End Community

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF...

What is it you do exactly for Hedge End Town Council and the community within your job role? My job mainly revolves around maintaining the cleanliness of our open/green spaces, this is through litter picking and checking the bins to see which ones need to be emptied, in which case I will empty them. I also give the play parks a visual check as I go around. The maintenance man Mike will do a thorough check. If I see anything which needs addressing, I will let him know.

Have you been with the Town Council long?

Four years, but I have lived locally in Hedge End for twenty two years. Before this I was a cleaner and have been very loyal to the companies I have worked for in the past. The longest being fifteen years.

When you are out and about what is the most common piece of litter you find all over?

Plastic drink bottles, cans, and sandwich packets is the most common litter I find all over. Most days I can fill between 5-10 black bags full of litter on my rounds which I will empty at the depot. My area generally stretches to all the council owned play areas, green spaces and some wooded areas. Eastleigh Borough Council maintain the village centre and streets.

What are the strangest things you find on your rounds?

Mainly shopping trolleys and fly tipping of leaflets, magazines, brochures etc. I often take shopping trolleys back to the shops in which they came from.

Does the weather ever stop you in your tracks?

No never, I am out in all weathers. 🏄

Is there anything you find particularly rewarding within your role?

The general public can be very kind. I often have residents pat me on the back and say, 'Good job' or 'Thank you for the work you do', which is always appreciated. Also, locals who will share with me information such as 'there is a lot of litter over by the tree' again, very helpful.

Could we be doing more to help, if so what?

- This sounds obvious, but please use the bins available to you and avoid putting your own general waste from home in the bins.
- Keep dogs out of play parks because these spaces really are for children only.
- Picking up after your dog makes all the difference to the work I do, and it's unpleasant for others who use open spaces.
- The smashed glass around shelters is an ongoing issue I deal with regularly. Whilst I do not expect it to stop overnight, by reporting anti-social behaviour to 101, can help avoid it continuing in the future.

HEDGE END HISTORY

From the years of (1914-1918), 37 men from the Hedge End area gave their lives for "King and Country" and the war memorial in St Johns Road includes many old Hedge End names, including some established village inhabitants. The first world war claimed victims from all social classes and the well-known strawberry fields were put to an alternative use for growing much needed vegetables to help with the nationwide shortage.

During the early years of the second world war, the threat of German air raids was a constant danger. The rural location of Hedge End was deemed a safe area for the relocation of children from more vulnerable larger towns and cities. Pictured (right) is a letter sent to Mrs Deacon of Lower Northam Road. Signed by H.M The Queen Mother thanking her for the hospitality shown to evacuees from Gosport.

The Hedge End Auxiliary unit base was located near to the wooded stream area in Woodhouse Lane. Formed in 1940 under the guidance of Winston Churchill. They were specially trained secret units of between four and eight men who had good knowledge of the local countryside. The men who are pictured below were often handpicked from the Home Guard and remained undercover within the volunteer force until the expected German invasion took place. The Auxiliary unit then would have gone to ground when the expected invasion arrived, to cause mayhem and sabotage to the Germans.

Starting life in an old concrete garage relocated from Romsey, we gradually built up a complex of sheds on the site, sadly in 2017, circumstances beyond our control forced us to seek a new home.

Early in 2018, we were lucky enough to find space in the Upper Hamble Country Park, where over the next few months we built a 50 ft long workshop which is now fully equipped for the work we do for the community.





Men's Sheds are similar to garden sheds only larger – a place to pursue practical interests at leisure, to practice skills and enjoy making and mending. The difference is that garden sheds and their activities are often solitary in nature while Men's Sheds are the opposite. They're about social connections and friendship building, sharing skills and knowledge, and of course a lot of laughter.
