TREE REPORT

Dr Anusha Singh kindly invited us along to her surgery to talk about setting up an NHS dental surgery here in Hedge End ...

When was Hedge End Dental Surgery established?

We opened in August 2011. I have a practice in Basingstoke and I wanted to open a second practice, so I spent a long time searching for the right location and we discovered Hedge End and our research showed it was desperately in need of an NHS practice.

Are you still taking on patients?

Yes, we are still growing strong and taking on new patients. We currently have approximately 11,000 patients on our books, not just from Hedge End but from as far away as Eastleigh. Many of our staff are local and it's lovely when patients come in and the staff know them, we really have great staff and you simply can't run a project like this without great staff!

What services do you offer to the community?

We offer general dentistry, fillings, extractions, plus other cosmetic treatments such as teeth whitening and the hygienist. We like to let our patients make an informed decision and decide what services they would like from the wide choice we have on offer. All patients are treated the same, whether NHS or non NHS, a message passed down to all staff.

How many staff do you have?

We currently have 5 dentists, 6 nurses, 4 reception staff, a Dental Hygenist and our Practice Manager. We have 26 staff across both practices, but we are very much in the 'growth phase', so our numbers are increasing. We are open Monday to Friday 8am until 8pm and 9 till 2 on Saturdays.



What training is involved in becoming a Dentist?

I trained to become a dentist in South Africa, where I was born. The training took 5 ½ years. Three years of medicine, before specialising in dentistry. I had to train for 3 years before I was allowed to work on real patients!



Where did you study?

I studied at the University of the Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, then, one week after qualifying as a dentist, I moved to the UK!

What does your typical day involve?

Well, I am up and dressed before the kids are awake, then I am set for the day. I work three days in Basingstoke and 2 days in Hedge End. I sometimes work on a Saturday too. I love working at both sites. I meet with the team to see how they are then I go to greet my patients so I can see how they are feeling. I feel it is really important to perceive how a patient is feeling before you treat them. No one day is the same, there is always a variety of issues to diagnose and solve. Then at the end of the day I switch off with my family, then, when the kids are finally in bed, I am thinking about work again!

What is the most important thing you do each day?

Pray... I'm so grateful to God for what I have! Then I can get on with the rest of the day!

What do you like most about being a dentist?

I love all parts of dentistry. I love problem solving and challenges...diagnosing an issue and being able to help a patient.

What is the most important piece of advice you could give to the community about their dental care?

Please come and see us sooner rather than later. It's much easier to help earlier on. Don't be afraid, we are very caring here. We listen and want to help.

Community News Wainwright Gardens - Neighbourhood Watch

WAINWRIGHT GARDENS INTRODUCE
NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH AND NO COLD
CALLING ZONE...

Residents of Wainwright Gardens in Grange Park have joined together to introduce a Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) and No Cold Calling Zone (NCCZ) with the support of the Police, local Councillor, Louise Bloom and local County and Borough councils.



Wainwright Garden's NHW and NCCZ Coordinator, Doug Toogood told us more about the scheme -

"The idea first came about following a get together during the Queen's Jubilee celebrations. Although we had no serious concerns, we felt that by having these schemes, it would stop any problems getting worse. We had enormous help from our (previous) PCSO Matt Wheeler, Local Councillor Louise Bloom and in particular, Jon Ridell (HEWEB Local Area Coordinator) at Eastleigh Borough Council.

We had an inaugural meeting in the Drummond Centre. The setting up of the No Cold Calling scheme was initiated by Hampshire County Council at Montgomery House, Winchester. The NHW scheme was through Hampshire Police and Eastleigh Borough Council. In both schemes they will supply the relevant forms and leaflets. There must be a 50% vote for NCCZ, and 60% for NHW. You need a coordinator and a deputy, if possible, to help distribute any information to residents and to cooperate with the police, if necessary. Lamp post



signs can be obtained for both NCCZ and NHW schemes at a small cost.

A lot of patience is required when setting up the schemes as it can take many months, however we feel it's been well worth it. It has helped local residents who now realise they have a community spirit for those who wish to take part!"

Grange Park Councillor, Louise Bloom added "It's really great to see residents working together for the benefit of the community and I'd especially like to thank Mr & Mrs Toogood who started this initiative, for all their hard work".

The street collection amassed £1664.41. Receipts at the gate were the highest ever and a lot more people bought draw tickets than usual. Add this to the record profit at last year's Firework Fiesta and that makes lots of money to support good causes around Hedge End. If you wish to apply for funds you are too late for this year, but come and get involved and help us to raise more next time around!

Thursday Lunch Club Fund Raising

The Thursday Lunch Club has been running in Hedge End since the early seventies. First starting in the Salvation Army Hall in Bursledon Road, then in 1977, when the Day Centre was built behind the Village Hall, they transferred to their hall and kitchen!

Some of the cooks and members have sadly since passed away including, Rhoda Lyons, Greta Hindmarch, Helen Hall and Mary Abraham. Sheila Hales is still in charge with three different sets of cooks and helpers taking it in turns to cook.

There are always about 40 members who come for a meal every Thursday with the help of Eastleigh Community Transport.

Over the past 8 years, the members have been running a charity fund raising lunch with up to 60 people attending, to raise money to give to their chosen charity. The first one raised money for the Mohlangen School in Africa to help supply books and other items for the children. We have also supported The Basic Doctors and Naomi House, as well as raising funds to provide chime bell equipment for the partially sighted and blind children's play area at Kings Copse Primary School.

We've also donated to the Street Pastors, Help for Heroes, Hounds for Heroes and this year, the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Air Ambulance. A representative from the chosen charity is always invited to attend and receive the donation. We usually raised between £350-£450 pounds! The events are appreciated by everyone who attends.

There is always a waiting list for the home cooked meals at the 2000 Centre. All staff and cooks are volunteers from Hedge End and the surrounding area. At the Christmas Lunch the Eastleigh Mayor is always invited to attend!
