8. Borough and County Council Reports

Cllr. Jerry Hall reported that the Eastleigh Borough Council Local Plan was discussed at the last HEWEB Local Area Committee and will shortly be released for an 8 week consultation. He encouraged all to read it and comment accordingly. There has been a delay involving the contractor and builders for works to the Fleming Park contract. Cllr. Jerry Hall stated that the flooding issue at Hobb Lane has now been resolved but there appears to be a similar issue at the Co-Op.

Cllr. Derek Pretty added that the Eastleigh Borough Council Local Plan is scheduled for consultation before Christmas. The new Marks & Spencer in Eastleigh will be opening in October.

Cllr. Bruce Tennent reported on health items and infrastructure matters. The NHS is developing a new model of care for the West Hampshire CCG (Clinical Commissioning Group). There are some 7 surgeries linked in with each other to aid in developing such a model. There are plans to develop well-being cafes to provide advice on health matters. In addition, the concepts of creating healthy-living pharmacies are being explored. Two further CCG sites are working on similar

concepts as part of Project Vanguard but working independently of each other. He touched on a damaging leaked report on NHS England relating to the premature deaths of people with learning difficulties.

Southern Water are going to be inserting a major pipe into the river Itchen as part of the Habitats Directive and this will cause severe disruptions around Allington Lane for a 12 month period.

There being no further business to transact, the Chairman closed the meeting at 19.59 hours.
