February 2022 Recreation and Amenities

1. Albert Road Cemetery

- 2 interments have been undertaken since my last report, 1 full burial(re-opening) and 1 interments of Ashes.
- The graves are always prepared to a high standard by our Groundstaff in all weathers and challenging conditions.
- By way of an update from last month, we intend to remove the Eastern Hemlock on the roundabout in the next couple of weeks.

2. Allotments

- There are currently 0 empty plots and a waiting list of 42, 12 of those are requests for second plots.
- The team has been busy clearing old stock fencing and recoppicing the area between Kanes Field and Spring Field. As part of the work we have opened up a new path between the 2 fields to allow safer access for our mower.




3. Bowling Green

• We are looking at creative ways to repair the concrete edgers that I have previously reported as needing replacement. The cost to replace the entire greens edgers is £30,000 and to replace just 1 side of edger would be £10,000. We are going to attempt to replace a small section using paving slabs, if it goes well, we should be able to replace all the damaged units this way at a fraction of the cost. I will update next month.

4. Conservation Volunteers

• This month's session took place at Gully Mead, this is an area of wet meadow within Wildern Local Nature Reserve. The task was to remove encroaching brambles and Willows from the meadow area. The results were impressive, and we managed to clear a much larger area than expected. Many thanks to all the volunteers that attended.

- Still issues with horse damage on pitches 3 & 4 at Rodaway.
- Pitches 1,2,3 & 4 are in play at Rodaway.
- Pitch 1 is in play at Greta Park.

• Works in the woodland adjacent Wellstead School have now been completed. A large amount of fly-tipping and rubbish was removed from the site. Selective scrub, brambles and sapling trees have been thinned out. This area is will now receive ongoing maintenance to ensure it remains safe to the public and to encourage a more diverse woodland habitat.



• Reeds that were transplanted into the Dowds Pond inlet stream to help reduce silt have taken very well and appear to be doing a good job. 2 sections have established, these not only help slow the water flow (reducing erosion), but they also filter out debris before it reaches the pond.
