R214 Correspondence

 A request had been received from Circus World Entertainment for the use of Greta Park – Sunday 13th June to Sunday 20th June 2021.

RESOLVED: That this request for use of Greta Park was agreed. The usual bond of £1,500 was to be paid, along with the rental charged of £81.32 + vat per day, however on top of this charge would be added the annual percentage increase from April 2021 All agreed.

Football and Cricket

The Turnpike Cricket Nets had now been replaced, following their removal earlier this year over safety concerns. The nets had been paid for in partnership with Eastleigh Borough Council. Both sports had resumed with limited facilities.

Open Spaces

Dowds Farm – There had been some tension over the summer between a limited number of anglers and dog walkers. It is believed that the issues related to non-authorised anglers of the pond not club members. HETC were engaging with the local site bailiff, scheduling regular meetings to try and reduce any future issues.

The rocker in the play area had temporarily been removed due to concerns about excessive movement in the mechanism. This should be covered under the warranty, but HETC were waiting for an update regarding this from the supplier.

Drummond Road

There was still ongoing issues with large groups of youths. Litter had increased significantly, with 15 windows currently requiring replacement.

Greta Park

Repainting, repair, and cleansing of the veranda area was being carried out.

Locke Road

A large TPO Oak within the play area had lost 2 large branches over the summer, this tree had now been significantly reduced to prevent further breakage.

Norman Rodaway

Items were still being dumped at the clothing and glass banks.

Turnpike Way

A teenage girl had got trapped within one of the toddler swing seats and had to be cut free by Hampshire Fire and Rescue.

Westward Road

The MUGA had been cleaned, with ROSPA repairs continuing to the play area.

Woodhouse Lane

Last month it was discovered that there had been built a bike/motorbike track within Bottom Copse. This area was a designated SINC (site important for nature conservation) and was covered by a TPO. All tools had been confiscated, the ground levelled and cease/desist notices put up. This incident was reported to the police and EBC Planning Enforcement.

Other

Work was continuing to open up narrow paths and reclaim overgrown footpaths.

Following a member of the Ground staff leaving, HETC were in the process of recruiting a new member for the team.

With the anti-social behaviour issues currently being experienced the Operations Manager asked for committee support in putting details of any vandalism along with photos on social media.

Members were in full support in the use of social media for this purpose.
